

UN expresses concern over rising food prices

United Nations Secretary General Ban Ki-Moon has expressed his concern over the [rising food prices](#)

in a recent interview with the BBC. The Secretary General stated that UN relief agencies could be forced to ration the amount of food aid they distribute if current trends continued, and that the high prices could hamper their ability to meet the UN Millennium Development Goals, which aspire to halve world poverty by the year 2015. Last year

[Australia](#)

was forced to slash its wheat harvest forecast by around 30%, after prolonged drought decimated crops. Record flooding across the

and

also severely affected cereal crop yields in these countries, pushing the price of wheat higher. As a result, many of the poor in countries such as Zimbabwe,

[Pakistan](#)

and Afghanistan can no longer afford to buy bread.

Quote: *"Mr Ban said that "many countries in particular in Africa they now have to pay double or triple the price for their bread," and warned that this would lead to increased malnutrition. "This will all affect our MDG programmes - I am very much seriously concerned about this," he said. The change has been blamed on poor harvests, population growth, rising energy and grain prices, the effects of climate change, and a shift to biofuel crops.*

It has already been described by some officials as the "[perfect storm for the world's hungry](#)", a combination of factors which have converged together to form a deadly storm of starvation, famine and disease and death. This situation, I believe, is different from any ordinary famine or economic depression. This is on a global scale, and it doesn't look like things are going to improve any time soon. This world has been marked for judgement. According to Scripture, as we near the tribulation period, things will continue to get worse and not better. The Bible states that one of the conditions that will characterize the tribulation period will be famine and hyper inflation, followed by disease and death (Revelation 6:5-8).
