

After months of intensive lobbying by ministers, the United Nations has finally granted the European Union <a href="mailto:sweeping new powers">sweeping new powers</a>, which will allow it to speak on behalf of itself at the UN General Assembly. Up until now, regional blocs have only had Observer Status with the United Nations. But under new rules they will be able to enjoy almost all of the privileges once reserved for nation states. European ministers have been

for a change in the way the United Nations is structured following the adoption

of the Lisbon Treaty in 2007. The ratification

of the treaty granted the European Union its own legal identity on the world stage for the first time in history. It also paved the way for the EU to speak on behalf of its member states at the United Nations as and when there is consensus among them. Previously the EU would have had to address the UN General Assembly through the government which held the union's rotating presidency, but now the permanent president of the European Union will have the right to address the General Assembly as if they were the head of a country. EU High Representative for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy, Baroness Ashton, expressed her delight at the decision, claiming that this will enable the bloc to speak with "a clearer voice"
