

EU leaders pledge support for Gaza

The Israeli government finally announced a unilateral ceasefire in Gaza this morning, ending three weeks of conflict in which over 1300 Palestinian Arabs and 13 Israelis were killed. A similar announcement from Hamas was released several hours later. While the Palestinian death toll may be horrific and no civilized person enjoys hearing of people losing their lives, Hamas must bear the ultimate responsibility for these figures. For Hamas often launch rockets from the midst of residential areas, knowing full well that Israel will be reluctant to return fire and cause loss to innocent life. The terrorist group stores its weapons in hospitals and schools in order to prevent its arms being destroyed in an Israeli air strike. And Hamas even established headquarters in the basement of [Shifa hospital](#) to prevent it from being taken out during a conflict with the Jewish state.

Quote: *"Shifa Hospital, which is situated in the more wealthy western part of Gaza City, is a very big hospital, but you can hear from the Palestinians who visit there -- it is somewhat of an open secret -- that Hamas commanders walk around the hospital, in some instances wearing doctors' robes," Israeli Public Security Minister Avi Dichter said. "In some cases the Hamas commanders kick medical teams out of rooms so that they can hold meetings."*

Yes, it seems that for Hamas, life in Gaza is cheap. For the Palestinians, [bombs](#) are more precious than lives. While the Israeli death count is comparably low, there can be no moral basis of comparison between the two figures. Hamas deliberately targets Israeli civilians, seeking to kill as many Jews as possible, while putting their own people in harm's way in order to prevent an Israeli reprisal. The loss of any innocent life is regrettable, but it all could have been prevented if Hamas would simply stop firing the rockets. If Israel does decide that the 'collateral damage' caused by an attack on a Hamas target is justified by the lives that would be saved as a result of the terrorists being taken out, then Hamas makes sure it scores a propaganda victory in the liberal press. "Look at this Israeli massacre," they'll say, "They killed innocent women and children." While they themselves would seek to do the same in an instant. Israel never seeks to deliberately kill innocent civilians, while Hamas does everything in its power to accomplish that feat. For Israel, it seems to be a lose-lose situation. No other country in the world would put up with such a situation, yet Israel is forced to do so by the international community. And some of those leaders from the international community met with the Israeli Prime Minister in his Jerusalem residence today, in an effort to strengthen the shaky ceasefire and establish the Middle East peace process that was begun at Annapolis one year ago. Mirek Topolánek have pledged naval assistance in ending the smuggling of weapons into the Gaza Strip, which has fuelled Hamas' murderous campaign for over 8 years now. for peace in the Middle East, and that the international community should accelerate its efforts to establish a Palestinian state in Gaza, Judea, Samaria and east Jerusalem.
