Quote: " The plan is not just to give Mr Solana a nicer, or more logical title. It would be a powerful new role. At the moment he answers to the Council, in other words the governments of the 27 EU

countries. This wouldn't completely change, but crucially,

under the all the functions of the

player, rather than a

constitution's proposals, he would take over commissioner for external

relations, currently the Austrian Benita

Ferrero-Waldner. This would give him access to a bigger budget, an embryonic

diplomatic service and a seat on the commission. as

vice-president. This is important because

the commission can propose laws and policies.

He would have the legal basis to become more of a follower of policy set down by others. Being at the pinnacle of two streams of power

is known in the jargon as "double-hatting".

So it seems Solana is in the right place at the right time to have a

great influence in the Middle East peace process. Whether he ends up being

the prophesied Antichrist or not, we cannot tell. But his role in

Europe is full of prophetic significance, and I couldn't
