A week has passed since BBC journalist Alan Johnston was kidnapped by Palestinian terrorists in the Gaza Strip. The journalist was due to end his posting in Gaza next month, but was captured by an unidentified terrorist group. Information on his well-being has not been released, and the BBC has made several pleas for his immediate release.

Javier Solana, the High Representative for the European Common, Foreign and Security Policy, has stated the European Union will be doing everything in its power to secure the release of Alan Johnston.

Foreigners have been kidnapped in Gaza before, and are usually released relatively quickly without harm. That is, as long as you aren't Jewish.

Corporal Gilad Shalit, who was kidnapped shortly before the outbreak of the war with Hizbullah, is still being held by Hamas in Gaza. And I presume it is Palestinian terrorists affiliated with Hamas that are also holding Alan Johnston. But it seems Johnston is in good company according to the BBC, who claim that Johnston's job was to highlight the "Palestinian predicament" in Gaza. It is very unlikely then their cause.

Quote: "The BBC described Johnston as a "highly experienced and respected reporter". "It is his job to bring us day after day reports of the Palestinian predicament in the Gaza Strip," said the BBC's diplomatic correspondent, Paul Adams, himself a former Middle East reporter.
