Within the past week, Israel and the Palestinian Authority have promised to recommence peace negotiations following a five year impasse, but hopes of a breakthrough remain slim.

President Obama has tasked US Senator John Kerry with finding a solution to the impasse. Israeli President Binyamin Netanyahu has agreed to a limited '<u>building freeze</u>' in Judea and Samaria, and also to the release of 82 Palestinian terrorists, a so-called 'good-will gesture' to the Palestinian Authority. The PA has also been demanding various financial incentives for agreeing to return to the talks, including the right to build an <u>airport</u>

in Ramallah and hotels along the shores of the Dead Sea. They are also seeking rights for natural gas exploration off the shore of the Gaza Strip. But Hamas is unlikely to permit that, and has already vehemently stated its

opposition

to the resumption of any talks, claiming that the PA does not speak for them...

Quote: ""Hamas rejects Kerry's announcement of a return to talks and considers the Palestinian Authority's return to negotiations with the occupation to be at odds with the national consensus," Hamas spokesman Sami Abu Zuhri told AFP. He said that West Bank-based Palestinian president Mahmoud Abbas had no legitimate right to negotiate on behalf of the Palestinian people.

The EU has also been making waves in the Middle East this past week. Last Friday the European Commission published a new <u>directive</u> stipulating that all future agreements between the EU and Israel must contain a clause specifically excluding their application to Judea, Samaria and east Jerusalem. Although official EU policy has never recognized Israeli sovereignty in these places, this is the first time the bloc has passed a law expressly forbidding economic co-operation in the territories. The EU is also looking at labelling Israeli products that are produced in the Palestinian territories. Israel has reacted angrily to the EU directive, freezing

co-operation with the EU in these areas.

Quote: "Deputy Minister in the Prime Minister's Office MK Ofir Akunis said in response that "it's a wrong and regrettable decision. Such steps – even before the Palestinians announced they are even ready to return to the negotiation table – are pushing the peace talks away, not drawing them closer. "Let them know even in Europe – Judea and Samaria are not 'occupied,' they're the homeland of the Jewish nation."

Historically Judea and Samaria are the homeland of the Jewish nation.
