

32 killed in attack in US University

Quote: *"Professor Liviu Librescu threw himself in front of the shooter, who had attempted to enter his classroom. The Israeli mechanics engineering lecturer was shot to death, but all the students "lived because of him," Asael Arad, an Israeli Virginia Tech student told - Army Radio. Librescu's wife, Marlena, told the NRG Web site that her husband had loved his job with "all his heart and his soul."*

I couldn't help thinking about this, and wondering what goes through the mind of someone who is willing to take the lives of others in such a horrendous incident. It is not believed the attack was terrorist related. My thoughts go to the Columbine massacre, and the fact that yesterday's attack came on Holocaust Remembrance Day. Rachel Scott was killed by the gunman for professing her faith in Jesus Christ.
